- Recruiting players and coaches for the Hockey Program;

- Mentoring, developing and supervising coaches for the Hockey Program;
- Organizing, conducting and running try-outs for the Hockey Program;
- Arranging and providing hockey clinics, power skating clinics, pre-tryout clinics, tournaments and other special programs for the Hockey Program;
- Attending practices, games and tournaments;
- Attending Colorado Amateur Hockey Association meetings and other meetings of leagues in which the Hockey Program participates;

- Assist in formulating and managing fee structures, operating and programming budgets and expense approval;
- Assisting with player and coach evaluations;
- Plan, organize and lead pre- and post-season information meetings;
- Monitor league and team performance, making recommendations to advance skill development through appropriate competition;
- Provide disciplinary recommendations and/or actions where necessary;
- Oversee training of Team Managers as well as LRR Committee Coordinators to ensure that procedures are set in place and consistent;
- Monitor ice usage and billing expenses within the organization.
