- Help create and monitor strength & conditioning program of student-athletes.
- Create and maintain effective working relationship with multiple departments across campus, including admissions, faculty, advancement, athletics, maintenance, etc.
- Explore, plan and engage in community service and fundraising projects for both the program and the athletic department as a whole.
- Plan, schedule and coordinate team travel including transportation, lodging and meals.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree.
- Experience coaching at the high school, college and/or professional level.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills.
- Ability to teach the game of hockey at a high level, both offensively and defensively, within the systems as set up by the Head Coach, while also providing valuable insight and input on ways to improve teaching and strategy.
- Dedication to the physical, social, emotional, and academic development of student-athletes, as well as the overall well-being of the individual student-athlete, the women's hockey program, the athletic department and the institution as a whole.
- Working knowledge of NCAA rules and demonstrated dedication to the ethical following of those rules.
- Current CPR and First Aid certificate or willingness to acquire certification.
