Welcome to Bonita Springs!

Welcome to Bonita Springs and the Hyatt Regency Coconut Point for the 2025 AHCA Convention! As in the past, we are providing a brief guide outlining what you need to know, especially for those of you attending your first AHCA Convention.

NAME BADGES: Anyone who has registered for the Convention will need a name badge to get into most sessions. The Convention comes with costs and so we need to monitor who gains access to certain events. Other than speakers and special guests, one needs to be a paid member of the AHCA to come to the Convention and attendees must also register and pay the appropriate Convention fee. To expedite the distribution of badges, registered members will receive their badges at league meetings immediately prior to the Convention. There will also be registration and badge pick-up from 12:30-1:30 p.m. on Sunday and from 7:30-8:00 a.m. on Monday.

MEMBERSHIP AND CONVENTION

COSTS: There are multiple Membership categories. NCAA Coaches (i.e., head coach, assistant coaches and volunteers) are covered by one fee: \$500 for a Division I program and \$300 for a Division II-III program. Anyone who makes a living in hockey but is not a "coach," can join as an Allied Member at \$100 for the year. A youth, amateur or high school coach can join for \$40. The in-



dividual Convention Fee is now \$300 (after March 1). The only other cost at the Convention would be for either of the Coach of the Year events. Actual NCAA staff members get in free. All others will be charged \$50 for either event. (Note: Award winners are not charged and get a free table to accommodate guests.)

SPECIAL EVENTS TO NOTE: Please see the section in this guide labeled Booth Sponsors that identifies the sponsors and where they will be.

Also, the two Coach of the Year events remain as they were last year. The men's event on Sunday evening is a reception with an open bar for beer, wine, and soda, for the first 45 minutes. There will be appetizers, and the program will end by 6:45 p.m. allowing attendees to go out for dinner. The dress code has been relaxed so no sport coats are expected. The women's event is again a luncheon on Monday with "business casual" dress being the norm. In addition to these celebrations there is the popular "Hockey Coaches Care Reception" that will take place Monday evening from 6:00 to 7:30 p.m. in the Cypress Courtyard. The reception raises funds for "Hockey Coaches Care," a relief fund sponsored by the AHCA, and provides a fun atmosphere to connect with other attendees.





THE GENERAL AGENDA: Beyond these social events, the heart and soul of the Convention can be found in the general agenda. **Zach McKelvie** of Army West Point has once again gone above and beyond to organize a mix of sessions delivered by accomplished outside speakers and AHCA members. The Convention will focus on hockey-related topics, including sessions devoted to NCAA playing rules, NCAA championships, NCAA legislation, and the future of college hockey with staff liaisons from the NCAA on hand to guide us through their areas of expertise.

SUNDAY - MAY 4

12:30 - 1:30 P.M. **Registration**

Attendees who did not receive their ID badges earlier in the weekend need to pick them up at this time slot (or Monday morning).

1:30 - 2:10 P.M. Opening Business Meeting

AHCA President **Steve Wiedler** of the University of Vermont will formally open the Convention. The traditional "AHCA Roll Call" will take place, with each attendee standing to identify themselves and their affiliation. A brief report will be given by AHCA Executive Director **Forrest Karr**.

2:15 - 3:10 P.M.

Dr. Anthony Randall *Topic: Practicing Excellence*

Dr. Anthony Randall will guide coaches on embedding excellence into their programs through

disciplined leadership and a winning team culture. He'll share practical strategies from his military and coaching experience to elevate performance on and off the ice.

Dr. Randall, President of Vanguard XXI, is an executive coach with over 28 years of leadership experience, including

service as a U.S. Army Ranger and Chaplain. A West Point graduate (1996), he's coached over 17,000 professionals across sports and military sectors. He's also the author of the best-selling Practicing Excellence.

Barry SmithTopic: Transitional Play

Barry Smith will break down transitional play using NHL game clips, highlighting strategies from his Stanley Cup-winning tenure. He'll show coaches how to build systems and design practice plans that enhance player development and shift their approach to thinking differently about transitional play.

Barry graduated from Ithaca College in 1972 and coached at Elmira College from 1976-81, compiling a record of 129-50-3. He later contributed to seven Stanley Cup victories (many as Scotty Bowman's righthand man) with Pittsburgh, Detroit, and Chicago. His career also spans the KHL and international coaching, earning him a spot in Ithaca's Hall of Fame (1992).

Men's and Women's Issues Meetings

The men's meeting is for Division I coaches while the women's meeting is for all members involved in women's hockey.

5:15 - 6:45 P.M.

Men's Coach of the Year Reception

This event is sponsored by USA Hockey; the reception (5:15-5:45) is sponsored by the USHL and NAHL; the Coach of the Year awards are sponsored by CCM.

Three of the AHCA Major Awards will be presented, along with the two AHCA/CCM Coach of the Year awards. The event is more of a reception than a full dinner and the dress code has been relaxed so that sport coats are not expected. Complimentary beer, wine and soda will be available for the first 45 minutes of the event. Actual NCAA staff will have no charge for this event. Everyone else must pay \$30 at the door. USA Hockey Report


USA Hockey is a major benefactor of the annual AHCA Convention. USA Hockey's **Scott Paluch** (an AHCA Governor) and USA Hockey staffers will give a brief report.

8:30 - 9:20 A.M. **Steve Thompson** *Topic: Goaltender & Player Development*

Steve Thompson will share insights on evaluating goalie talent, focusing on key traits to identify during recruitment and tryouts. He'll outline

strategies to build season-long development plans that strengthen team goalies' skills and performance.

Steve has been USA Hockey's Manager of Goaltending Development since 2019, and has coached Team USA to international success, including a 2022 Olympic silver medal. A former University of Alaska

Fairbanks player, he began his coaching career at Anchorage. His work now shapes goaltending programs nationwide.

9:30 - 10:20 A.M. **John Riley** *Topic: Space Invaders*

John Riley's "Space Invaders" session will explore puck protection, reading defenders, and creating

space on the ice, using NHL clips to illustrate key techniques. He'll provide drills and strategies to help coaches develop these skills in their teams.

John serves as the Tampa Bay Lightning's Director of Amateur Scouting, focusing on talent identification and development. He previously coached Yale University's women's hockey team and the

Norwegian National Team. His expertise bridges scouting and on-ice coaching.

Women's Coach of the Year Luncheon

Mark Wick & Randy Barker Topic: Breaking the Ice: A Coach's Role in Mental Health

Mark Wick and **Randy Barker** will equip coaches to spot signs of stress and burnout in players and themselves, offering tools to build a supportive team environment. They'll draw from their therapy and coaching expertise to show how mental health strengthens performance.

Mark Wick is a mental health therapist with 35 years as a college hockey coach. He holds master's degrees in education and clinical mental health counseling. His career focuses on addressing the psychological challenges faced by athletes and coaches.

Randy Barker, a licensed therapist with 20 years of experience, directs counseling at UW-Superior and created the PERMANENT

well-being model. A former junior and NCAA hockey player and coach, he's shaped NCAA mental health best practices.

NCAA Hockey Panel with Charlie Baker, NCAA President

Panel: Maura Crowell, Dartmouth Coach; Guy Gadowsky, Penn State Coach; Heather Weems, NCHC Commissioner; Jim Madigan, Northeastern AD. Moderator, Adam Augustine, Big Ten

Charlie Baker became the NCAA's sixth president in March of 2023 and has pursued a mission to improve the student-athlete experience, increase national office efficiency and advocate for college sports. In less than two years, he expanded support for student-athletes by launching a post-eligibility insurance program for all three divisions and worked with membership to enact Division I core guarantees — mandatory health and wellness benefits for student-athletes and new academic protections such as guaranteed scholarships if a student-athlete stops compet-

ing. He led the negotiation of a landmark media rights agreement with ESPN, increasing visibility for college athletes as they compete for a national championship. Additionally, Baker initiated the development of a fan database that will enhance the championship experience for all.



CHARLIE BAKER

Baker and college sports leaders continue to enact an array of policy changes enhancing collegiate athletics oversight — including Baker's leadership in advocating for the banning of prop bets on college sports to protect the health, safety and well-being of over 500,000 student-athletes and the integrity of NCAA competition. On his first day in the position, Baker committed to meet with individuals from every conference office annually — a first for any NCAA president — and he has been intentional about soliciting feedback from student-athletes, coaches, administrators, athletics directors and conference commissioners. Baker thinks college sports are a uniquely American treasure, provide unmatched opportunity for young people to access higher education and in turn serve as one of the greatest human development programs in the world.

Before assuming his current role, Baker served as governor of Massachusetts — winning reelection in a landslide — and was consistently ranked as the most popular governor in America. He led the commonwealth out of a billion-dollar budget deficit and into a surplus while cutting taxes and boosting investments in education and infrastructure. In addition to his two terms as governor, he has decades of experience spear-

heading transformations at high-profile institutions in the private and public sectors. During this time, he also co-authored "Results: Getting Beyond Politics To Get Important Work Done."

Baker is a graduate of Harvard, where he was a member of the men's varsity basketball team. He holds a Master of Business Administration from the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern.

istration at Division I, II, and III levels. He now works one-on-one with coaches and leaders to navigate professional and personal challenges. Based in New Hampshire, he enjoys family time and the outdoors.

9:00 - 9:50 A.M. **Colin Chaulk** *Topic: Preparing & Evaluating the Power Play*

Colin Chaulk will share strategies for designing

and assessing effective power play units, drawing from his success with the Bakersfield Condors' top-ranked AHL power play. He'll provide drills and evaluation techniques to help coaches

optimize player performance and unit cohesion.

Chaulk, head coach of the Bakers-field Condors (AHL) since 2022, led the team to a 37-31-4 record and consecutive Calder Cup Playoff berths. In his first full season, he guided the Condors to a team-record 10 straight home wins.



COLIN CHAULK

Previously an assistant coach with Bakersfield, he helped achieve a 23.8% home power play rate in 2021-22. Additionally, Colin has served as head coach of Brampton Beast (ECHL), as well as assistant coach for Fort Wayne Comets (ECHL), Kalamazoo Wings (ECHL), and Belleville Senators (AHL). A former player with 15 pro seasons, his #91 is retired by the Fort Wayne Komets, where he won five championships. His hands-on coaching style has developed NHL-bound talents like Philip Broberg and Dylan Holloway.
